Pronunciación

[həˈləʊ]

Definición

(exclam.) Used as a greeting or to begin a telephone conversation.

Ejemplo

Hello how are you today?



goodbye

Pronunciación

[ˈgʊdbaɪ]

Definición

(exclam.) Used when leaving or ending a telephone conversation.

Synonym: See you (soon). (abbrev.: Bye, Bye-bye)

Ejemplo

Goodbye. See you soon!



good morning

Pronunciación

[ˈgʊd ˈmɔːnɪŋ]

Definición

(exclam.) Used as a greeting before 12 p.m.

Ejemplo

Good morning! Time for breakfast.

Vocabulario



good afternoon

Pronunciación

[gʊd'aːftənuːn]

Definición

(exclam.) Used as a greeting between 12 p.m. and 5/6 p.m.

Ejemplo

Good afternoon. What time does the shop close?



good evening

Pronunciación

[gʊdˈɪːvnɪŋ]

Definición

(Exclam.) Used as a greeting from 5/6 p.m or when the sun sets.

Ejemplo

Good evening! How was work?



sorry

Pronunciación

['spri]

Definición

(adi)

- 1. Feeling sad through sympathy for someone.
- 2. Feeling regret.
- 3. In a poor or pitiful state.

Ejemplo

I'm sorry, here is a flower.

goodnight

Pronunciación

[gʊdˈnaɪt]

Definición

(Exclam.) Used when leaving, ending a conversation or going to sleep at the end of the day.

Ejemplo

Goodnight. Sleep well.



thank you

Pronunciación

['θæŋk juː]

Definición

(Exclam.) An expression of gratitude.

(Abbrev.) Thanks

Ejemplo

Thank you for the beautiful flowers.



today

Pronunciación

[tə'deɪ]

Definición

- 1. (noun) This present day.
- 2. (adv) On or during this present day.

Ejemplo

What day is it today?

Vocabulario



class

Pronunciación

['kla:s]

Definición

(noun) A group of people or students who learn or are taught together. Synonyms: Lesson, study group.

Ejemplo

I'm the teacher. Welcome to the class!



welcome

Pronunciación

['welkəm]

Definición

- 1. (verb) To greet someone in a polite, friendly way.
- 2. (Exclam.) Used to greet someone in a polite, friendly way.

Ejemplo

Welcome to my house!



name

Pronunciación

[neɪm]

Definición

(noun) A word, or words, used to refer to someone or something.

Ejemplo

My name is Alex. What's yours?

Vocabulario



surname

Pronunciación

['ss:neɪm]

Definición

(noun) A last name shared by all members of a family, different to a first name.

Ejemplo

My surname is Irish.



man

Pronunciación

[man]

Definición

(noun) An adult human male.

Ejemplo

He is a man.



woman

Pronunciación

['wʊmən]

Definición

(noun) An adult human female.

Ejemplo

She is a woman.

boy

Pronunciación

[icd]

Definición

(noun) A male child.

Ejemplo

He is a boy.



girl

Pronunciación

[g3:l]

Definición

(noun) A female child.

Ejemplo

She is a girl.



yes

Pronunciación

[jɛs]

Definición

(exclamation) An affirmative response.

Ejemplo

Yes, my name is Laura.

Definición

(exclamation) A negative response.

Ejemplo

No, my name isn't Paul.



Gramática: Subject Pronouns

I - They

We use **subject pronouns** before the verb.

| | Singular | Plural | |
|------------|---------------|--------|--|
| 1st Person | I | We | |
| 2nd Person | You | You | |
| 3rd Person | He / She / It | They | |



Gramática: The Verb "Be" Affirmative

BE Present Tense Affirmative Singular.

1st Person Singular

I am Sam. I'm Sam.

2nd Person Singular

You are Sue. You're Sue.

3rd Person Singular

He is Tom. He's Tom.

She is Daisy. She's Daisy.

It is Tony. It's Tony.

BE Present Tense Affirmative Plural

1st Person Plural

We are Fred and Jack. We're Fred and Jack.

2nd Person Plural

You are Jane and Jim. You're Jane and Jim.

3rd Person Plural

They are John and Mary. They're John and Mary.


